Robeson Community College IGA nearing completion

Robeson Community College's energygrade investment audit is nearly complete. The audit began in September and is expected to four or five months to complete at estimated cost of \$103,000. A preliminary on-site review of RCC facilities identified energy savings ranging from \$88,000 to \$225,000 a year.
